Preliminary Religious Ritual Schedule:

- **Wednesday, 24 June 2026 – 5:30 AM – 5 PM** - Ganapathy Homam – Invocation and blessings of Lord Ganesha.
- **Thursday, 25 June 2026 – 8 AM – 6 PM** - Various Homams (Vedic Fire Rituals) – Sacred offerings of ghee, grains, herbs, and other items into the consecrated fire while Vedic mantras are chanted.
- **Friday, 26 June 2026 – 8 AM – 5 PM** - Ganapathy Pooja, Punṇiyākavācaṇam (Purification Ceremony).
 - **7 PM Special Oil Lamp Pooja** with participation by devotees.
- **Saturday, 27 June 2026 – 9 AM – 5 PM** - Sankalpam - Special Pooja.
 - **Special Pooja for granite sponsors of the “Rajagopuram” (Temple Main Tower) from 10 AM onwards.** *Sankalpa* is a sacred Vedic vow or spiritual resolution, representing one's sincere intention and commitment to the highest truth.
- **Sunday, 28 June 2026 – 8 AM – 5 PM** - Purification ceremonies and sanctification rituals associated with the Nine Planets (Navagrahas). **Ceremonial Oil Anointing to the deities by the Devotees. In Tamil “Ennai Kaapu”.** All Devotees are encouraged to participate this important ritual as the ONLY chance to touch the Deity before Consecration Ceremony.
 - **This ritual of “Oil Anointing” (“Oil Bath” Ennai Kaapu in Tamil)** will continue for three days as follows:
 - **Sunday, 28 June 2026 – 8 AM – 9 PM**
 - **Monday, 29 June 2026 – 8 AM – 9 PM**
 - **Tuesday, 30 June 2026 – 8 AM – 1PM**
- **Monday, 29 June 2026 – 8 AM – 4 PM** -Continuation of purification ceremonies together with Ankurarpanam, the symbolic “Seed Offering” ritual performed prior to reinstallation and consecration.
- **Tuesday, 30 June 2026 – 8 AM – 4 PM** - Entry into the Yagasalai (Yaga Shala), the specially constructed sacred pavilion where elaborate Vedic fire rituals are conducted as part of the Maha Kumbhabhishekam (Consecration) ceremonies.
- **Special Day of the Consecration Ceremony** – see details below

Wednesday - 1 July 2026 – Consecration Day

- Ceremonies will begin at approximately 5:30 a.m.
- With the most **auspicious moment occurring at 10:05 a.m.**
- During this sacred time seven **Kalasams** will be ceremonially installed atop the Rajagopuram by the officiating priests. See full details of the officiating priests in the Tamil notice.
 - Officiating priests from Kanchipuram, Pillaiyaarpatti – Tamilnaadu – India.
 - Toronto, Canada, UK and USA.
- Special vegetarian lunch will be served to all devotees by the sponsors.

- **Kalasam** - During a temple consecration ceremony (known as Kumbhabhishekam), the Kalasam refers to the sacred metal pots placed at the apex of the temple towers (Gopurams or Vimanas). They act as reservoirs of divine cosmic energy and lightning conductors.

- **Chanting of Vedic MANTRAS will take place daily from Day One of the above schedules from 24 June 2026**

Mandala Abishekam

- Following the Maha Kumbhabhishekam, a **24-day Mandala Abishekam** will be observed, during which daily sacred rituals and ceremonial ablutions are performed for the deities. These ceremonies are believed to enhance the spiritual energy of the temple and bestow blessings upon devotees and society at large. Such an opportunity is rare and traditionally occurs only once every twelve years.
